The Sport Premium Funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following OBJECTIVE:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

Swimming Performance Data

Swimming is an important skill and can encourage a healthy and active lifestyle. All pupils participate in swimming lessons which take place at Ellergreen Sports Centre and are run by the Liverpool School's Swimming Programme.

Our aim is to ensure all our pupils can:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
